Subject: Transmittal of the Final Audit Report for CBFO, Recertification Audit

QAD-A-25-08 of the Advanced Mixed Waste Treatment Project

Dear Mr. Nance:

This letter transmits the Final Audit Report for the Carlsbad Field Office (CBFO) Recertification Audit QAD-A-25-08 of the Advanced Mixed Waste Treatment Project (AMWTP) for processes performed to characterize and certify waste in accordance with the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) Hazardous Waste Facility Permit (HWFP). The audit was conducted August 18 – 21, 2025.

The audit team concluded that, overall, the AMWTP program procedures for characterizing contact-handled (CH) transuranic (TRU) summary category groups (SCGs) S3000 homogeneous solids, S4000 soils/gravel, and S5000 debris waste adequately address upper-tier requirements. The AMWTP processes for characterizing CH-TRU SCGs S3000 homogeneous solids, S4000 soils/gravel, and S5000 debris waste were satisfactorily implemented and effective in all areas.

A total of 10 concerns were identified during the audit, with none considered WIPP HWFP Waste Analysis Plan (WAP)-affecting. Five (5) non-WAP-affecting conditions adverse to quality (CAQs) were identified, resulting in the issuance of five (5) corrective action reports (CARs). Please note CAR 25-023 has been assigned to the CBFO National TRU Program Certification Division. One (1) non-WAP-affecting CAQ was determined to be isolated in nature, only requiring remedial action, and was corrected during the audit. Three (3) non-WAP-affecting Observations were identified, and one concern was presented to management as a recommendation.
