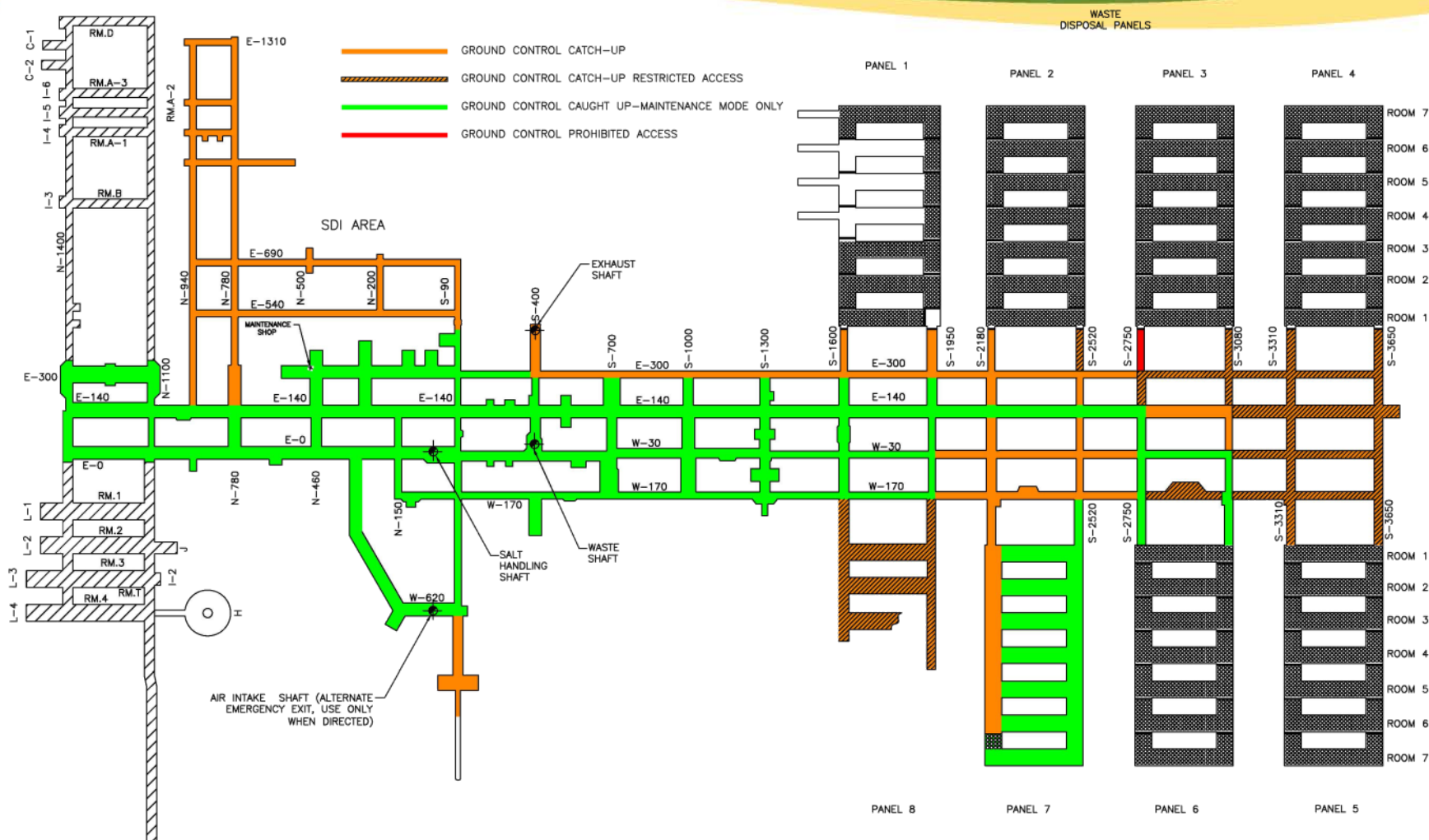


Strengthening Temporary Safety Basis

- Temporary Safety Basis violation on April 20 led to 100% review of Temporary Safety Bases control implementation
- Conducted three days of special work pauses to improve the implementation
- Integrated effort with management providing training and employees providing feedback
- Based on the outcome of these meetings, 7 Temporary Safety Bases will be consolidated to 1

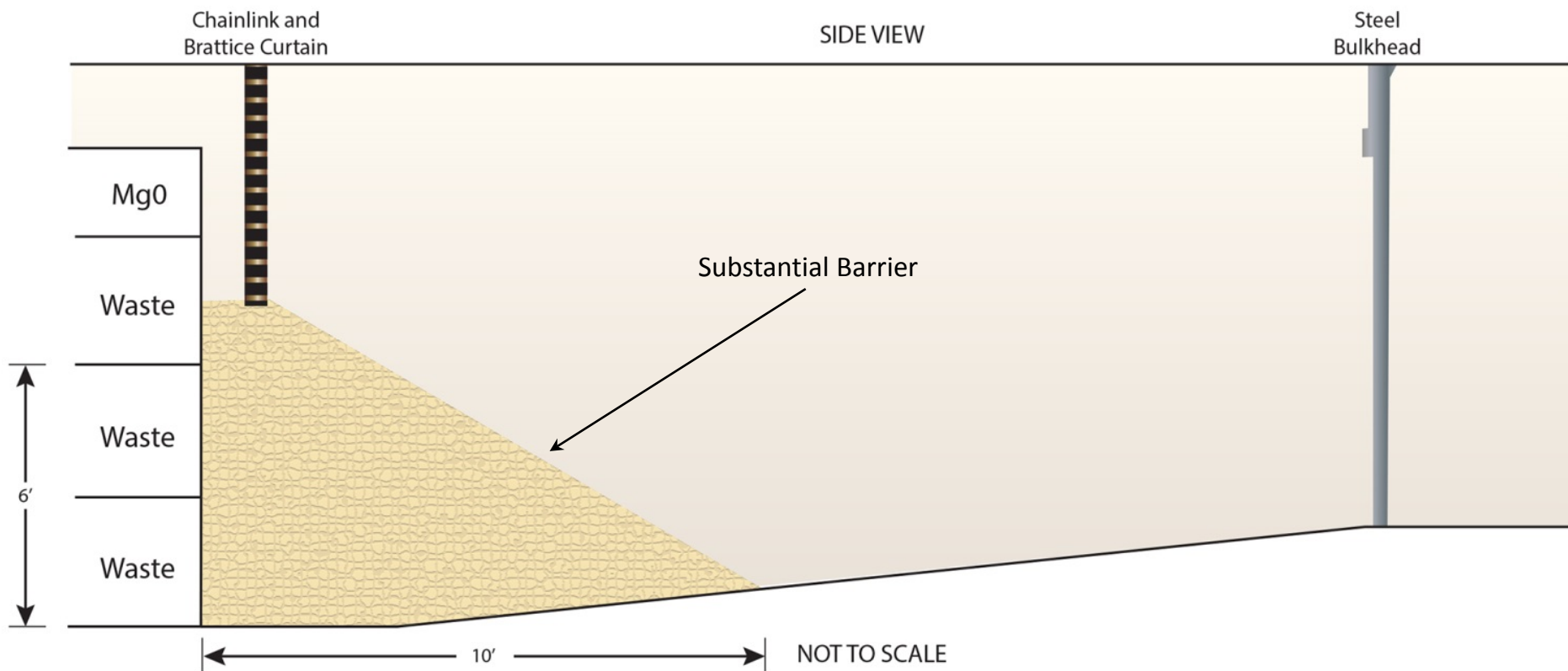


Ground Control



- Bolting activities are continuing in both uncontaminated and contaminated areas
 - Over 1,900 bolts installed as part of the “catch-up” bolting activities

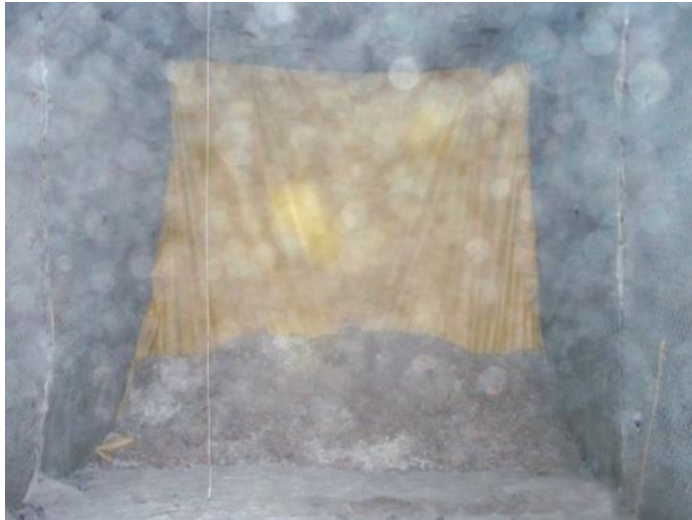
Initial Closure of Panel 6



“Substantial barrier” means salt or other non-combustible material installed between the waste face and the bulkhead

Panel 6 Initial Closure

- ✓ Closure of air intake side complete
- ✓ Chain-link, brattice, and 10 feet of mined salt placed at the air exhaust side of Panel 6
- ✓ Bulkhead installed
- ✓ Installation of the flashing completed



Panel 7, Room 7

Panel 7, Room 7

- Brattice and chain link anchored on the air intake side of Panel 7, Room 7
- Bulkhead has been installed (on inlet side) with flashing work remaining
- Completion forecast in June



Interim Ventilation System

- April 13 – Fan/Filter units received at WIPP
- April 17 – During receipt inspection, damage was identified
- May 1 – Both units were relocated to the Carlsbad NFT/EPD facility for further inspection and repairs
